How to Enter

1. Please let the organisers know which categories you intend to enter **before the show**, by telephone on 01275 331303 or by email at flower.show@chewstokeharvesthome.org.uk. Entries can be made in person on Friday 7th September at Chew Stoke Church School from 8.30am to 9.30am and at **Providence House, Providence Place, Chew Stoke, BS40 8TY** from 2pm until 9pm. You can pay for entries in advance or on the day.
2. Entries can be declared on the day of the show, but each entry will be charged **double** (unless the entrant has already placed entries in other classes in advance).
3. Children's entries for classes 89-102 to be brought to Providence House by 5.30pm on Friday 7th September so that they can be prepared for display - unless already submitted at Chew Stoke Church School.
4. All other exhibits to be **taken to the flower tent** and displayed by the entrant **by 10.30am** and must not be removed until after prize giving on the day of the show (at around 4.30pm).
5. Vegetables, fruit and flowers exhibited in Classes 1-38 must have been grown by the exhibitor. Any exhibitor found showing produce not grown from their home/garden or allotment will be disqualified from winning any prize at the show.
6. An exhibitor may make no more than three entries in a class but may only take one prize.
7. The committee will take ordinary care of exhibits but will not be responsible for any loss that may occur.
8. If there are 3 or fewer entries in any class the value and number of prizes shall be at the discretion of the judges.
9. Children and young people's cash prizes and certificates will be given at a special Chew Stoke Church School assembly; any children not attending the school may collect their cash prize and certificate from the flower tent after the prize giving.
10. The judges' decisions are final!
