2. You can do this anytime up until 8pm on Friday 5<sup>th</sup> September.
3. Other ways to enter are to phone 07920 246 322, email [flower\\_show@yahoo.com](mailto:flower_show@yahoo.com) or in person at **4 Malcolm Close**, Chew Stoke, BS40 8FG from 5pm until 8pm on Friday 5<sup>th</sup> September. Entries made in advance are **FREE**.
4. Entries made in person at 4 Malcolm Close will be handed a reference number to be placed next to the exhibit on the day.
5. **All exhibits (except those made in school) to be taken to the flower tent and displayed by the exhibitor by 10.30am** on Saturday 6<sup>th</sup> September and must not be removed until after prize giving on the day of the show (at around 4.30pm).
6. The committee reserves the right to dispose of any exhibit not collected by 5:30pm.
7. You will be given a reference number for each exhibit to be displayed on, or next to, your item.
8. Entries can be made in person on the day of the show (at the flower tent before 10.30am), but each entry will be charged **50p** (unless the entrant has already placed entries in other classes in advance).
9. Vegetables, fruit and flowers exhibited in classes 1-40 must have been grown by the exhibitor. Any exhibitor found showing produce not grown from their home/garden or allotment will be disqualified from winning any prize at the show.
10. An exhibitor may make up to three entries in a class but can only take one prize.
11. The committee will take ordinary care of exhibits but will not be responsible for any loss that may occur.
12. If there are 3 or fewer entries in any class the value and number of prizes shall be at the discretion of the judges.
13. Children and young people's cash prizes and certificates will be given at a special Chew Stoke Church School assembly; any children not attending the school may collect their cash prize and certificate from the flower tent after the prize giving.
14. The judges' decisions are final!
